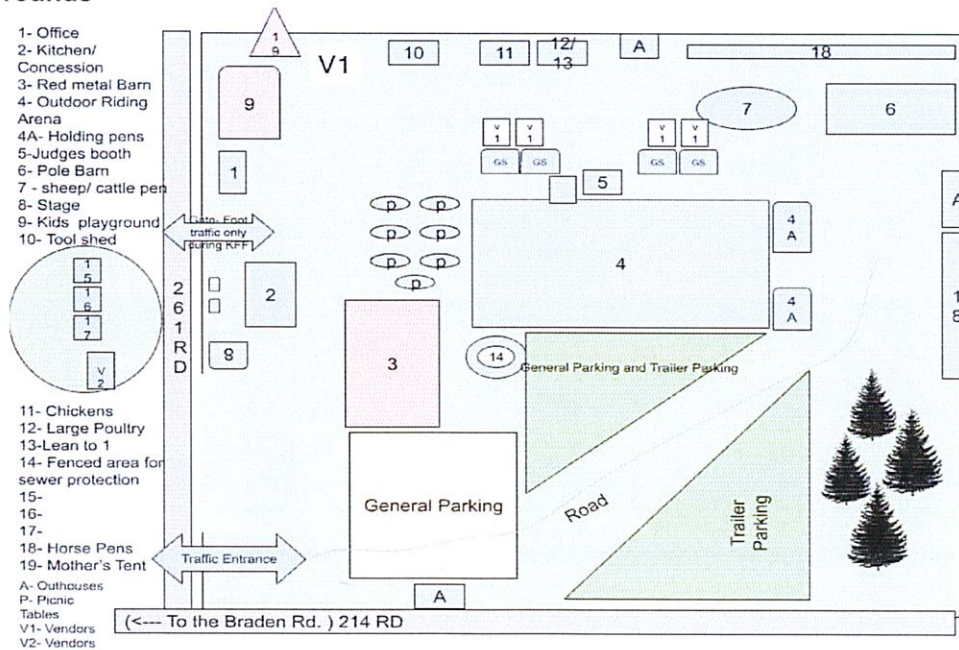

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. **Prizes are cash, gift cards or gift certificates - no cheques will be mailed; prize money can be collected from the office until 7:00 pm Sunday.**
 - i. *Unclaimed prize money will be held for 1 month and then donated back to the next Kiskatinaw Fall Fair if still unclaimed after September 24, 2025.*
 - ii. *Contact 250-219-1630 to collect prize money between August 25 and September 25, 2025.*
2. Gift cards may be awarded in place of cash depending on the sponsors.
3. All participants in the Heavy Horse Show, Heavy Horse Pull, Light Horse Show and Cattle Shows MUST complete the required "Acknowledgement of Risk and Release of Liability" forms.
4. Unaltered animals may be entered in appropriate classes as long as their handler has them under control at all times; the handler is to sign a declaration to that effect.
5. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning the cages, pens and stalls being used by their animals; cleaning deposits may be required by departments.
6. All livestock must be sound and disease free.
7. All livestock must be bonifide property of the exhibitor for at least one month prior to the fair, with the exception of horses.
8. Animals shown by youths in youth classes cannot be shown in adult classes.
9. Water will be supplied by the board; contestants must provide own feed.
10. Livestock exhibits must have approved indicators (traceability tags).
11. One entry per exhibitor per class.
12. No coaching from the sidelines.
13. Handicraft articles must not have been shown in any previous Kiskatinaw Fall Fair.
14. All exhibits must be grown or manufactured by the exhibitor and all articles must be correctly named and labeled; see show standards document on fair website: <https://sunsetprairierec.ca>
15. In case of few entries in a class, or exhibits not up to standard, the awarding of first or any place will be at the discretion of the judges.

16. The Fair Board will not be responsible for loss, damage or injury to person, equipment, or animal on the Grounds.
17. The Fall Fair Board will not accept responsibility for exhibits on the Grounds after 5 pm Sunday.
18. Judges cannot enter in classes they are judging or enter a building while entries are being taken.
19. Judges cannot judge classes in which immediate family members have entries.
20. Ages are determined as of January 1, this year. Please check specific departments to for age categories.
21. The Fair Board reserves the right to decide any point not covered by these rules.
22. DOGS: Must be kept on leash. For the comfort and safety of all visitors and livestock, no dogs are allowed around any animal exhibits, display buildings, concession areas, or in the arena. Owners must clean up after dogs.
23. The Fall Fair will pay for engraving on trophies up to 30 days after the fair.
24. No one will be permitted in the Rabbit and Poultry Section after 5:00 pm except owners feeding their rabbits or poultry.
25. For the enjoyment of everyone visiting the fair, we ask that all exhibits remain on the fairgrounds until 4:00 p.m. on Sunday unless there are special circumstances where the exhibits need to leave early.
26. ***NOTE:** There is no shelter on the grounds for your horses. If you have an animal that requires more shelter than our open stalls, you must provide that yourself.

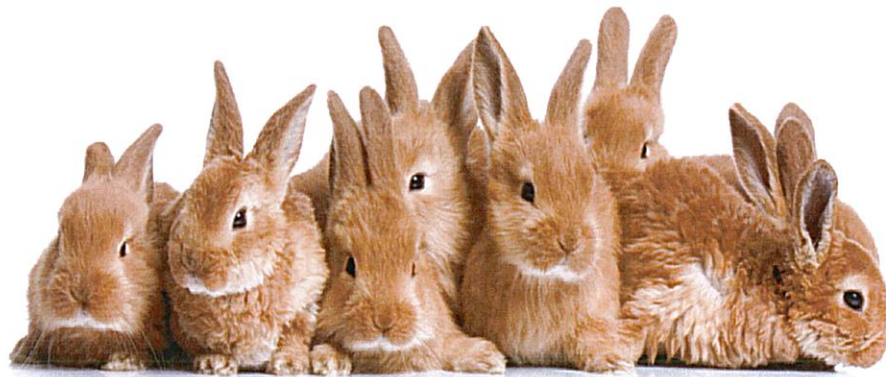

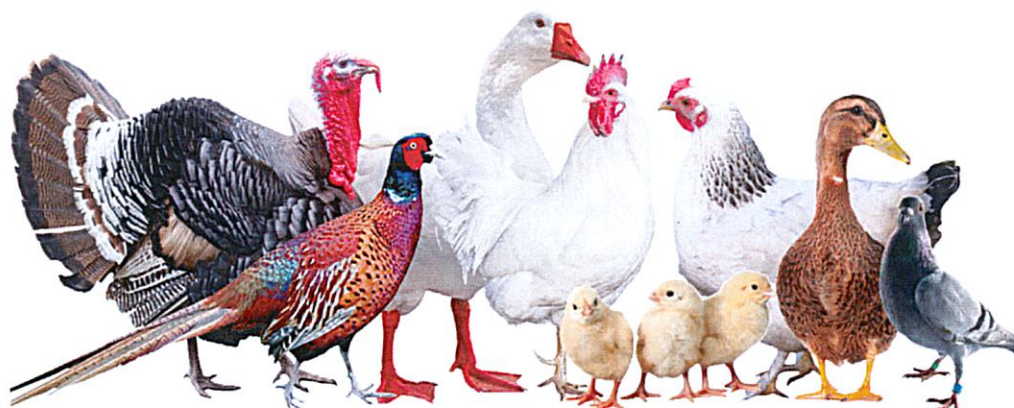

All show committee members and helpers are volunteers; please show your appreciation for their time and efforts.

Regulations

1. Breaks to be held at the discretion of the show committee.
2. All patterns will be posted by 8 a.m. Sunday morning.
3. English or Western attire and tack accepted in Halter and Showmanship classes.
4. All competitors in English classes MUST wear hard hats with harness during competition and/or practice.
5. Numbers must be visible while in the ring.
6. All entries must be filled in and signed by the exhibitor. PARENTS MUST SIGN FOR JUNIOR EXHIBITORS.
7. Judging ring will be closed no later than 2 minutes after completion of the preceding class. Gate holds may be requested prior to the class with the gate person.
8. Gate person will be calling out for exhibitors by numbers while the preceding class is in session. Exhibitors are responsible for being ready and available at the time of their class.
9. Trail will be set up and judged in a separate area from 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm.
10. There is to be NO PRACTICE on the competition trail area course. Failure to stay off the trail course will result in disqualification.
11. **Prize money can be collected 30 minutes after the end of the light horse show.**

Rules & Regulations

1. All cattle must be on fairgrounds by 9:00 am Sunday, and must remain on the grounds until 4:00 pm Sunday (unless previous arrangements have been made with the beef chairman)
2. All cattle must be halter broke
3. All cattle must have a neck rope in addition to the halter when tied in the barn
No horned animals permitted. Polled or scurred animals only.
4. NO drugs to be used on show cattle
5. All calves exhibited must be born on or after Jan 1st of current year
6. Please be prepared to show registration papers for the bulls upon request
7. Exhibitors must have stall signs for animals (DOB, breed, name, sex...)
8. All cattle must be the bona-fide property of the owner for at least one month prior to fair day.
9. Yearling and Mature Bulls must be handled with either a humbug or nose ring at all times
10. Yearlings and mature Bulls cannot be shown by anyone under 16.

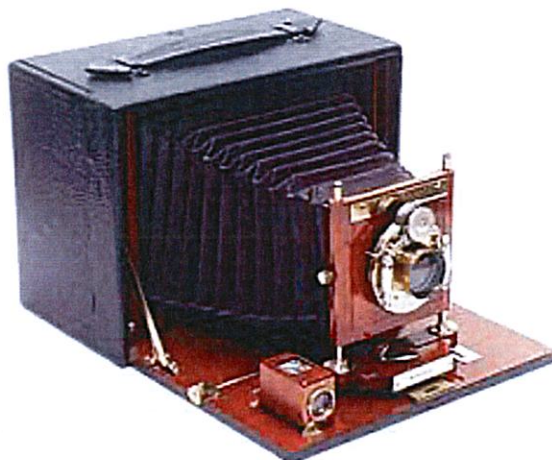

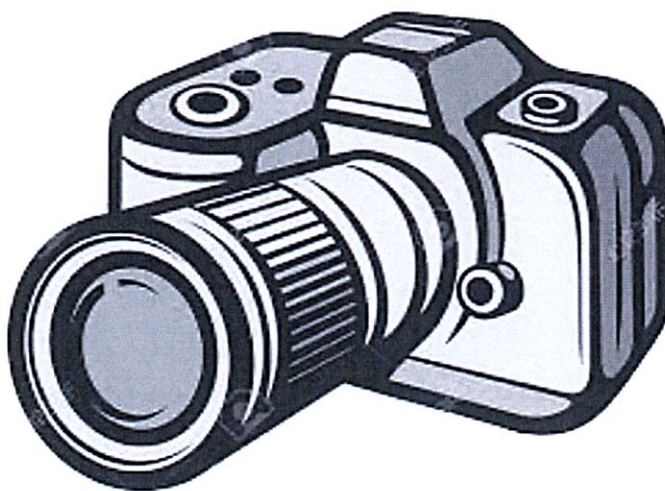
